A year of transformation



At Our Neighbors' Table (ONT), we are building the future of food security for more than 32,000 people in need by creating people-centered programs, convening regional partnerships and engaging our communities.

In 2024, we reached the halfway point of our 10-year plan to eliminate hunger in our region by 2029. And after a year of transition out of the pandemic in 2023, we started our work to transform the region's food safety net.

Those milestones included:

- **Expanding access** by offering two free markets for the first time - our new Salisbury market and expanded Amesbury location
- **Convening partners** through the Lower Merrimack Valley Food Coalition (pictured on cover), uniting food providers across 17 communities to strengthen the food safety net
- **Building infrastructure** with the Seacoast Regional Food Hub to provide crucial storage and distribution capacity and reinforce the food supply for ONT and our partners



Our investments are paying off. In 2024, we served more people than ever before and distributed 1.9 million pounds of food across the region.

Transforming lives

Our Neighbors' Table provides innovative, guest-centered programs that reduce stigma and improve access to healthy food, helping more individuals and families seek the help they need. As a result, we served more people than ever before in 2024 and expanded our impact across the region.

FILLING EVERY TABLE

By opening a Salisbury market and doubling the size of our Jardis-Taylor Center market in Amesbury, we were able to provide **1.5 million pounds of groceries to 2,897 households**, more than any year in our history.

SERVING OUR SENIORS

Through partnerships with Councils on Aging in Merrimac, Groveland and Salisbury, we are able to provide access to supplies from the Greater Boston Food Bank that can be distributed at their facilities. Through these programs, **we provided 65,894 meals** to our senior neighbors last year.

DINNER SERVED WITH DIGNITY

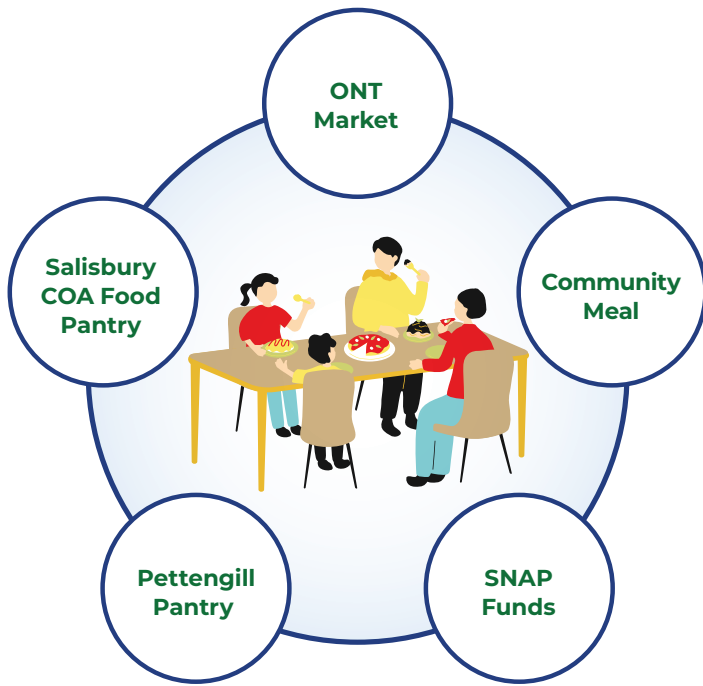
Our organization was founded in 1992 by a small group of volunteers in Amesbury who wanted to provide a warm meal and companionship to neighbors living with less. That tradition continues today, providing **more than 18,000 meals** to our neighbors in 2024.

BOOSTING FOOD BUDGETS

Public programs like SNAP, formerly known as food stamps, serve an important role in the local food safety net. But in Massachusetts, an estimated 880,000 people qualify for benefits yet don't receive them. Our Service Coordinator assists with the application process, resulting in over **\$433,000 in new SNAP funds** going into local food budgets and our economy in 2024.

A STABLE TABLE FOR SALISBURY

At Our Neighbors' Table, we are building food security one life and one family at a time. When a Salisbury mother and her baby came to our Community Meal last year feeling desperate and in need of help, she was treated with dignity and surrounded with services from ONT and our partners.

ONT's Stable Table™ model creates and measures community-level food security on the strength of three legs — local food resources, public programs like SNAP, and engaged communities willing to take action. Salisbury is the latest success. By expanding access to healthy food, growing community support and working with partner agencies, we exceeded the estimated need in 2024.

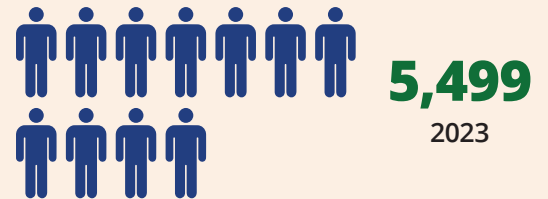
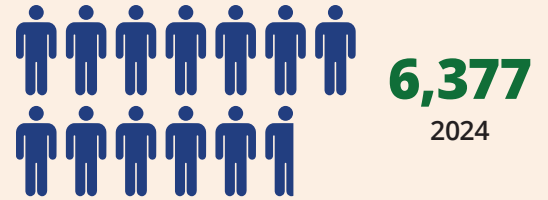

Transforming communities

Frontline food providers in our region do heroic work with limited resources. They meet the growing need despite limited ability to store food, particularly fresh food; heavy reliance on volunteers; and no trucks for transport. For many of them, the Seacoast Regional Food Hub is already a gamechanger.

HAVERHILL — SACRED HEARTS FOOD PANTRY

Sacred Hearts and Director Bill Lapierre have served the Haverhill area for over 30 years. By receiving their food deliveries at the Hub instead of driving a rented U-Haul to Boston, they cut volunteer time in half and were able to expand their storage with a new shed.

NEWBURYPORT — AMONG FRIENDS MEAL PROGRAM

Executive Director Bonnie Schultz and the Among Friends meal program have served a warm meal every week for more than two decades at St. Paul's Church. "We were having to use ONT's van to go to Boston, and find cold storage at Shaw's or other places. Now we use the van to drive over the bridge to the Hub. It's nice and easy for us. It's so exciting."

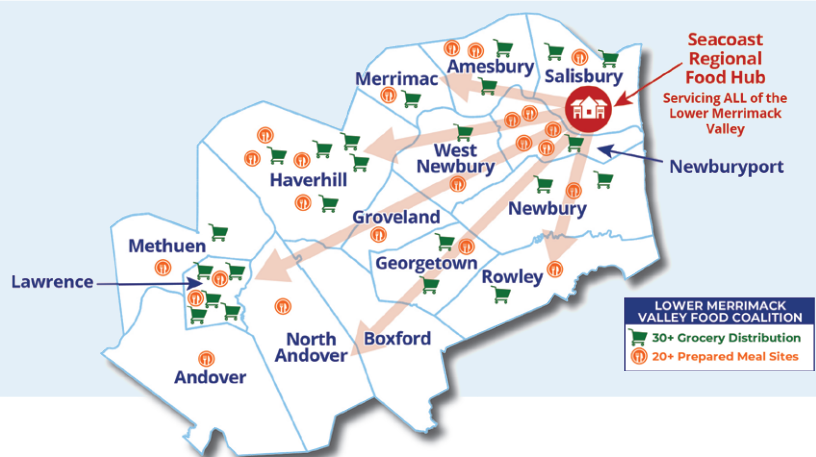
GREATER LAWRENCE — NEIGHBORS IN NEED

Neighbors in Need, one of the larger providers in the region, accessed more than 332,000 pounds of food and was able to distribute hundreds of turkeys at Thanksgiving thanks to the additional storage provided by the Hub.

After years of planning, the **Seacoast Regional Food Hub** is now providing the storage and distribution infrastructure our partners need to increase the food supply to the communities they serve.

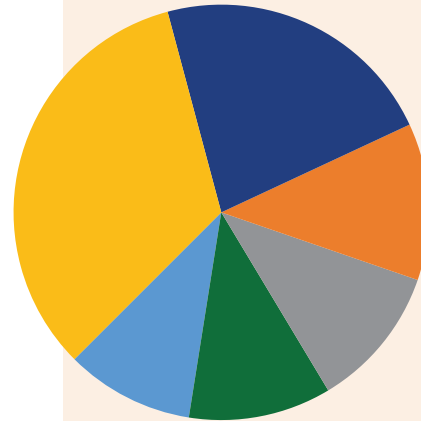
With a warehouse that has more space than a 747 airliner and three refrigeration units, each with the capacity of two school buses, the Hub is ready to transform the food safety net across the region.

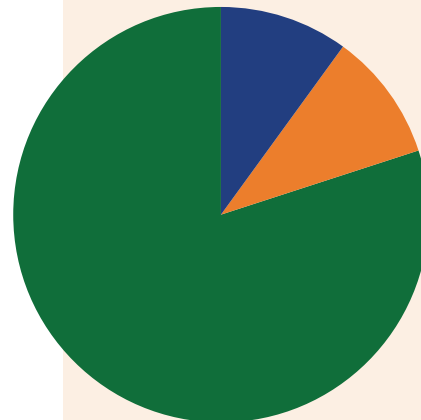


YOUR INVESTMENTS IN FOOD SECURITY
