Heather's Recipe: FRITTATA CAPRESE



Sick of the same old breakfast? Try this easy egg dish!

PREP TIME: 10 Minutes
COOK TIME: 15 Minutes

SERVES: 4
INGREDIENTS:

- •6 large eggs
- •1/3 cup heavy whipping cream
- •1/2 tsp salt adjust to taste
- •1/2 cup of shaved parmesan
- •1/2 cup pearl mozzarella balls
- •1/2 cup cherry or grape tomatoes
- •6-8 fresh basil leaves torn into small pieces
- •¼ cup chopped onion if desired
- •1 cup
- •1 tbsp butter
- •3/4 tsp of garlic salt

DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Heat oven to 400 degrees
- 2. Spray 9x9 baking dish with non-stick coating or butter
- 3. Wisk eggs, whipping cream & garlic salt together
- 4. Cut tomatoes in half and chop onion into small pieces
- 5. Pour egg mixture into the baking dish and then stir in tomato & onion
- 6. Stir in fresh basil and mozzarella pearls
- 7. Sprinkle shaved parm over the top and then bake for 17 minutes

Free help to get the Child Tax Credit & Stimulus Payments

Did you miss out on the Child Tax Credit (CTC) or Stimulus Payments because you didn't file taxes? The CTC is \$250/ month for eligible kids between 6 and 17 and \$300/month for kids under 6. There is now a simple, easy online form to connect eligible families with the CTC and Stimulus Payments. The new form is in English and Spanish and mobile friendly. SNAP Update

EBT Card to Culture Admissions Discounts – The Department of Transitional Assistance and the Mass Cultural Council have partnered to offer discounted admissions to over 250 Massachusetts museums and cultural institutions/ performances. You can receive free or reduced admissions to these places by showing your EBT card. P-EBT cards will also qualify through the end on 2021. Discounts and availability vary by institution, so you may want to call the place you want to visit first for details.
