SNAP Update

Due to the high increase in fuel prices that has occurred during the current winter season, DTA slightly increased the Standard Utility Allowance, which is used to calculate SNAP benefits. Some SNAP recipients may see a small increase in their benefit amount as a result. For those who are affected, DTA sent recipients a text message advising them of the change in benefit amount on their regular SNAP issuance date in March.

P-EBT update: DTA is working on a plan for P-EBT benefits for the 2021-2022 school year and summer 2022, so hold on to your P-EBT cards if you were previously issued one. Details of the plan are still to come. If you lost or discarded your P-EBT card, report it immediately so you can get a replacement card. You can request a new P-EBT card online at

Heather's Recipe: CRUNCHY RANCH CHICKEN FINGERS

Kids love this! So easy & quick to make.

PREP TIME: 10 Minutes
COOK TIME: 35 Minutes

SERVES: 4

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 lb. Boneless Skinless Chicken Breast cut into strips
- 1/2 bottle of Ranch Dressing
- 1 Sleeve of Ritz Crackers crushed (any brand is fine)
- Salt and Pepper

DIRECTIONS:

- Place the ranch dressing and the Ritz crackers in separate bowls
- 2. Grease a 9×13 inch pan
- 3. Salt and pepper the chicken
- 4. Dip the chicken in ranch dressing and then dip in the crackers
- 5. Place in the pan and bake at 350 degrees for 25-35 minutes

Volunteer Profile: Veronica Carleo



Veronica Carleo has been volunteering at Our Neighbors' Table for about 4 years as a Market and Office volunteer. Her participation in various volunteer positions, Veronica says, allowed her "to see the ONT operations from different angles." She came to ONT after a friend and former ONT Board

member, Eli Bailin, pointed her to ONT's mission and impact. Veronica met Eli around 7 years ago when the Newburyport track was condemned and they helped to create an organization called "Friends of Newburyport Track" to fix it. Friends of Newburyport Track is a passion project of Veronica's because her and her family love running. The organization brought together groups of coaches, running clubs, and applied for grants to create a brand new 8-lane track with facilities.

Veronica knows the effects of poverty, mental health, and food insecurity through her brother's battle with addiction. She admires "the understanding and empathy of everyone at ONT and the way they empower volunteers with information." Veronica says that, beyond the information she uses during volunteer shifts, she is able to spread awareness of food insecurity through personal networks as well. She also loves the connections she makes with Guests, "I have developed relationships with Guests through orders I take over the phone week-to-week."

Veronica was born in Nebraska but has lived all over the country. She even lived in Japan for a bit while her husband worked for Nike! Veronica worked in marketing at wildlife conservation organizations and the American Lung Association. She has lived in Newburyport for 18 years and has 3 sons: Nicholas, Jack, and TJ. In her free time, Veronica likes to hike, watch her kids run races, and snowshoe with her dogs.
