# **Heather's Recipe:** MARSHMALLOW SNOWMAN

These are fun to make with the littles in your life!

PREP TIME: 10 Minutes

#### **INGREDIENTS:**

- 3 regular sized Marshmallows
- Chocolate cookie icing
- Pretzel Sticks
- Candy Corn

#### **DIRECTIONS:**

- 1. Squeeze on eyes and a mouth to one marshmallow using your chocolate icing.
- 2. Cut a slit in the middle and press in a candy corn for the nose.
- 3. Cut another slit in the backside and press the marshmallow on the edge of your mug.
- 4. Add 2 dots of icing to another marshmallow and press 2 pretzel sticks in the sides.
- 5. Add another dot of icing on your last marshmallow and press in 2 pretzel sticks to the bottom.

Place them in your mug and watch your snowman relax in his hot cocoa bath.

Whether you're shopping for groceries, or need a referral to another agency for services, we are here to help. One way we can help is by processing your SNAP application! SNAP (aka Food Stamps) puts money in your wallet so you can buy groceries at the grocery store. Having SNAP doesn't prevent you from shopping at ONT's market, but it gives you money to buy the things we don't carry. Most of the people who shop at ONT would qualify for some money from SNAP but half of you are not enrolled! Don't leave this money on the table! Make your appointment with Tress before the year ends – ourneighborstable.org/SNAP or call our office!

#### **SNAP Update**

Getting SNAP automatically qualifies you for discount utility rates with National Grid and Merrimac Light Department. If you've provided a utility bill to DTA, you should see the discount reflected on your bill. If not, you can apply directly to the companies for the discount by completing a quick online application and sending them a copy of your EBT card or approval letter from DTA.

#### **Energy Assistance Programs**

Due to the pandemic and high natural gas prices worldwide, electricity and gas supply prices are set to be very high this winter. New and expanded assistance programs are available to help customers pay bills or manage the increase.

If you are behind on your utility bills, you should **call your utility company** immediately and ask about their payment plans. Utilities are offering several customer assistance programs, including flexible payment plans (regardless of income), and balance forgiveness plans for those eligible. You will be protected from shutoff if you make payments as scheduled under the plan. Also you may qualify for a **low-income discount rate** if you do not already get one.

#### **Income-Eligible Assistance Programs:**

#### LIHEAP/Fuel Assistance

Fuel Assistance has much higher income guidelines than other types of assistance programs, so even if you don't qualify for SNAP or other programs, you may qualify for fuel assistance. You can get Fuel Assistance even if you pay (unsubsidized) rent and your heat is included in your rent.

#### Massachusetts Good Neighbor Energy Fund

If your income is too high for fuel assistance but you are still struggling with heating costs, you may qualify for assistance from the Good Neighbor Energy Fund. You apply through your local Salvation Army. In our area, contact the Newburyport Salvation Army at (978) 465-0883.
