FREE At- home Covid Tests

The government is issuing 4 free at-home covid tests per family. The website to order them is officially up and running. For free Covid tests

go to: **Covidtest.gov.** You will simply need to provide your email address and your mailing address - money is not required, health insurance is not required! It's simple, just sign on and order your 4 free Covid tests. It takes 1 minute!



<u>Heather's Recipe:</u> Easy Peanut Butter Cookies

Only 3 Ingredients! Your family will beg you to make them again & again!

INGREDIENTS

- 1 cup of peanut butter (crunchy or creamy)
- ½ cup of sugar
- 1 egg

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees.
- 2. In a large bowl mix together peanut butter, sugar and egg.
- 3. Scoop out a spoonful of dough and roll it into a ball. Place the cookie balls onto a nonstick baking sheet.
- 4. To help the cookies bake more evenly, flatten balls by pressing down with a fork across the top and then do it again in the opposite direction creating a crisscross pattern.
- 5. Bake for 8-10 minutes or until the bottom of the cookies are golden brown.
- 6. Remove from baking sheet and cool
- 7. Grab a glass of milk, your favorite kid and enjoy the moment!

Market News Additional Toiletries

When placing an order for groceries you can now add **two toiletries to your cart in addition to one roll of toilet paper**. If you have children in your household, you can also add one pack of any size diapers. SNAP Update

The Biden Administration has extended the federal public health emergency declaration due to COVID until at least mid-April 2022. This means that the COVID emergency allotments will continue for SNAP recipients until at least then. The emergency allotments are put on your EBT card on the $2^{\rm nd}$ business day of the month following the month it is for. For example, the February emergency allotments will go on the cards on March $2^{\rm nd}$, and the March allotments will go on the cards on April $4^{\rm th}$.

SNAP recipients can now use their SNAP EBT benefits to buy groceries online from participating BJs stores for pickup and delivery. Bls is the seventh SNAP online retailer in the Commonwealth, joining Stop & Shop, Walmart and Amazon, as well as ALDI, Hannaford, Price Chopper and Stop & Shop via Instacart. All BJs clubs accept SNAP and now also accept SNAP EBT payments on BJs.com for in-Club curbside pickup, shipment to home and same day delivery. Similar to using SNAP benefits to purchase food in a store, benefits can be used to buy SNAP-eligible foods online, including fresh produce, frozen foods, dairy and eggs. The SNAP maximum gross income guidelines have been increased for 2022 to reflect the increased cost of living. If you were previously screened for SNAP and told you were slightly over the income guidelines, call Tress at ONT to be re-assessed using the new guidelines. Fuel Assistance

It's not to late to apply for Fuel Assistance for the 21-22 winter heating season! Applications can be submitted up until April 30th. The income guidelines for Fuel Assistance are higher than other publicly funded programs, so even if you do not qualify for SNAP or MassHealth, you may qualify for Fuel Assistance. Below are the 2022 annual gross income guidelines for Fuel Assistance, which is also called LIHEAP.

The Fuel Assistance program assists eligible households pay their heating bills during the winter/spring season or until benefits are exhausted. Fuel Assistance clients also receive various discounts such as telephone discounts, electric discounts, and gas and oil discounts. Clients will also be provided help with past due arrearage management as well as access to the other energy assistance programs that help save money.

Whether your heat source is electric, oil, natural gas, propane, kerosene, coal, or wood, Fuel Assistance can help with the costs for eligible households.

Is your heat included in your rent? You can still apply for fuel assistance. If you qualify, Fuel Assistance will pay a portion of your rent directly to your landlord.
